Federal Advocacy

BCSE works with congressional leaders and executive branch officials to share the benefits of policy mechanisms that expand markets for existing energy efficiency and clean energy technologies.

This includes educational outreach and providing input into the development and implementation of energy, tax, environmental, and federal appropriations policies.



International Advocacy



BCSE is an accredited observer organization before the United Nations and participates at the convenings of the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC).

BCSE also promotes members' clean energy leadership and solutions at international events, including the Clean Energy Ministerial and Climate Week NYC.
